- Club's TSBP Approved Proceeds of Lottery Recipients List has been updated with the Town to reflect the name change of the Bruce Peninsula Health Services Foundation to BRUCE PENINSULA HOSPITALS FOUNDATION. A copy of the updated list has been provided to Scott Elliott & Richard Bouillon and has been updated in the Members Corner on the Club's website.
- Letter has been sent to Families for Autism along with TSBP Checklist requesting detailed information that would allow them to be added to the Club's TSBP Approved Proceeds of Lottery Recipients List. This organization is responsible for the "Let's Communicate" signage recently installed in Bluewater Park & there is opportunity for the Club to support similar signage at PSDS and Wiarton Hospital.

Report from Kathy:

- a) Foundation:
 - An amount of \$2265.00 has been remitted by the Treasurer to The Rotary Foundation based on Club membership as of July 2021.

b) International:

- In August a request to the Club from Rotary International & District 6330 asked all clubs to consider a donation to ShelterBox at that time. Although ShelterBox does not designate any donation to a specific area of concern in the world, they were dealing with a high demand exacerbated the earthquake in Haiti. After consideration the Committee decided to *donate \$500*. These are funds that would be in the budget, although the budget was not passed at that time, but would have been paid out later in the Rotary year. Both President Trevor and Treasurer Scott were consulted. An e-mail was sent to the Club members advising them of the donation & included a message from ShelterBox Canada that would provide members with a method of donating personally should they wish to do so. At this time a ShelterBox team is on the ground in Haiti.
- Kathy continues to be an active member of the *Hand Up Committee*, currently acting as Secretary. The Committee has just begun a water project in Guatemala & is currently fundraising & considering future project possibilities.

Report from Director Mike:

- A District Grant Application was submitted by Bob in April for the installation of fencing at the Wiarton Salvation Army's Hope Springs Community Garden project that has been under way for the last couple of years. It was originally thought that the project would be completed in 2021. Unfortunately, a number of unforeseen things have arisen that have delayed the project until 2022. As a result, the Club will be unable to see fencing installed in 2021.
